



NEWSLETTER 2020

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In the Day Hospice we are feeling sad, we are missing all of our lovely patients, the building is very quiet, only staff that are needed to enable the hospice to carry on providing services have actually been in the building.

The Day Hospice staff have been working with the Hospice at Home team, at the start of the pandemic some colleagues were furloughed, others have been working from home, it's been a very strange seven months.

We have missed the hustle and bustle of everyone being here, the volunteers who are here to help both the patients and the staff, volunteer and ambulance drivers who bring patients in. Heather would always look after drivers with tea and biscuits, and if they are very lucky they would get cake in the afternoon, in fact she looked after all of us and we have certainly missed our hot lunches.

Our patient caseload increased overnight as we contacted everyone including the patients on their programme break. It was very important that we kept in contact with everyone, some of our patients live on their own and the Day Hospice may have been the only social contact they had each week. We have made thousands of telephone calls, offered advice and support where we could and signposted to other services if there was a need.

Now that we are trying to get back to some sort of normality, we have set up some virtual day services, we are helping some patients learn new computer skills and we are having Zoom meetings so patients and staff can interact with each other. We have Zoom sessions on craft work, on how to handle any symptoms that they may have, we have afternoon tea, which Heather prepares and they get delivered by volunteers in time for everyone to have tea together. We have Complementary Therapy sessions where Ali talks about meditation and relaxation.

We are very excited with how the new services are progressing and look forward to building on them for the future.

It has been a very busy year for the Hospice at Home team. The pandemic has changed so much for us all. With patients not able to visit the hospice, the staff in the Day Hospice have joined us in the Hospice at Home team and we are now a much busier team - we are seeing double the number of patients to pre-pandemic levels.



We are still visiting all the patients that are referred to us for help with their personal care. Respite visits were a little more difficult as many of our patients were shielding because of their age and medical issues, and early in the pandemic they preferred not to have anybody visiting their homes.

This meant we also made a lot of phone calls to make sure all of our patients and their families were coping, we supported them as much as possible. It was important that they felt they were still part of our hospice family. We have known some of them for a long time, we hated that we couldn't visit and support them as we have in the past. We are a team of huggers and we all found it very difficult keeping a social distance.

Things have settled down a little now, even though we are wearing a lot of PPE. We are now providing all aspects of our service again and everyone is happy that they can now speak with us face to face. Even though they can't actually see our face, (some would say that's a blessing!), we still want to hug everyone we visit but hopefully we will be able to do that sometime soon.

The team have been working hard to develop new skills, taking on new roles across the community and working with the new virtual Day Hospice programme. We have had a lot of support from our friends, family, from our patients, their families and from the wider community. We have had some lovely gifts to help keep our spirits up. We will never be able to say thank you enough for all the support we have received.

Rapid Response Days and Nights continue to see high volumes of patients with both teams averaging over 175 contacts a month. The night team offers support for the new Rugby team, as well as the team for Rapid Response in the south of the county. The daytime team has a new member of staff called Amy, she has extensive palliative experience both in the community and an inpatient hospice setting. We welcome Amy on board to join Sarah and Aqeela. The Rapid Response daytime team will continue to cover the whole of northern Warwickshire on a permanent basis, having originally been a rural north based pilot. This ensures that Mary Ann will provide a 24/7 rapid response service to all patients living in northern Warwickshire, in collaboration with our colleagues at South Warwickshire NHS Foundation Trust.

We are continuing to support the on-going development of our staff within these teams, with both Ellen and Hannah well on their way to becoming independent nurse prescribers. This will allow the teams to provide quicker and more effective symptom control for our patients by giving them the ability to prescribe end of life drugs, rather than having to request GP visits.





Rapid Response service covers all of northern Warwickshire as a way to improve accessibility to end-of-life care.

We collaborate on the Rapid Response service with South Warwickshire NHS Foundation Trust.

Throughout lockdown our Rapid Response programme has been a shining light of community care.

The Family Support and Bereavement Services team were quick to move to remote working from home on 17th March. We moved from our traditional method of providing face to face support to providing all support by phone. We are very proud to say no one missed a support session while we made this change.

At the same time we sadly said goodbye to Sarah as she moved to Scotland and we welcomed Isabelle and Michelle to the team. What a steep learning curve they had, learning a new job without being able to actually come into the building and meet people!

We continued to provide bereavement support, and support to people with a life limiting illness, during lockdown and throughout the summer. We recognised that COVID-19 had a huge impact on bereaved people, taking away their normal coping strategies, making them feel even more isolated and potentially not allowing them to say goodbye to their loved ones.

In July we extended our remote services by providing group support sessions over Zoom. This was new territory for us and clients and, although it took a little while to get used to the technology, it was really great to be able to connect bereaved people together to support one another. We also launched a new group support service called Serenity – a place for people to come together to relax, unwind and get some much needed 'me' time.



In September we took another step forward by providing 1:1 support for children over Zoom. It has been lovely to be able to support bereaved children again, especially as they start the new transition back into school.

The team have worked so hard this year in very trying times. It is so important to us to continue supporting bereaved people and those coping with life limiting illnesses. We have needed to be imaginative and flexible in how we do this, but not even a global pandemic can stop us from helping you!

DID YOU KNOW ... LYMPHOEDEMA



UNDERSTANDING LYMPHOEDEMA -ALL ABOUT OUR SERVICE

Our Lymphoedema Service offers treatment for patients who have developed Lymphoedema as a side effect of their cancer treatment.

Lymphoedema is a swelling that can affect any part of the body, but mainly the arms or legs.

We offer a dedicated lymphoedema treatment service. We were one of the first hospice providers to offer treatment in this area, before that it was difficult to find lymphoedema treatment in Nuneaton, Bedworth & North Warwickshire.

The condition can be controlled by using the treatments below:

- Compression therapy
- Manual lymphatic drainage (a specialist message)
- Exercise advice
- Advice on skincare

The service aims to enable patients to independently manage this life-long condition.

The kitchen is very quiet without our patients and our wonderful volunteer team. I have kept in touch with all the volunteers and we look forward to being able to work with them again in the not too distant future - pandemic permitting of course!


